

What is SAVE?

Government agencies use the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) Program to obtain immigration information they may need to help determine if you are eligible to receive public benefits; such as a Social Security number, Medicaid, housing assistance, food stamps, or a driver's license.

SAVE can confirm your naturalized or derived citizenship or immigration status with a registered agency, so they can determine whether you are eligible for the public benefits they administer.

Check your SAVE case with CaseCheck

CaseCheck is a fast and free service that gives you updates about when you should return to the benefit-granting agency to receive your benefit. After applying for a public benefit, you can follow the progress of your SAVE case online by using CaseCheck.

When using CaseCheck, be sure to use the same document information you provided to your benefit-granting agency.

TIPS TO GET QUICK RESULTS

Following the below steps will help SAVE complete your case in just seconds.

- 1. Make sure your records are accurate
 If you changed your name or other
 information, you may need to update
 your immigration record.
- 2. Show recently issued documents
 If you received a new immigration
 document, you should present this to
 get faster results.
- 3. Check with your agency
 Contact your agency regarding what
 documentation you should present
 to process your application.
